Washington County residents can now dispose of their unused and expired medications at a year-round collection drop box.





## Why are unused medications a problem?

Old and unused medicines in your home can pose a risk for accidental poisoning, theft, and drug abuse. Research also shows that medication put in the trash or flushed can pollute water and harm fish and wildlife.

## What's accepted?

Prescription, over-the-counter, and pet medication in any form **from households**.

- » Pills & capsules
- » Blister packs
- » Creams & gels
- » Inhalers
- » IV bags
- » Liquids
- » Patches
- » Powders
- » Sprays
- » Vials

## What is NOT accepted?

- No needles, syringes, lancets or thermometers. Bring these to the **Environmental Center** at 4039 Cottage Grove Drive, Woodbury MN
- No medications from businesses.

## Preparing for drop off

- Keep medications in the original container and place in a sealed, clear plastic bag.
- Use a marker to cross out your name on the container. Drop off is anonymous—no ID is required.
- If you don't have the original container, place it in a clear plastic bag and write the name of the medication on the bag.
